## **Sports Premium Funding**

## 2021 - 22

This academic year Woodcroft Primary School will receive £17490 for 2021/22 and carry forward £16249 from 2020/21. This gives a total sports premium of: £33,739. The substantial carry forward was due to cancelation of activities through lockdown.

Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport you offer.

This means that you should use the premium to:

- develop or add to the PE and sport activities that your school already offers
- build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

Continuation of forest school activities in conjunction with the Acorn centre at Billy's lake. Develop orienteering and outdoor skills.	Estimated £2500	The cost is currently estimated but may include a range of suitable outdoor clothes and equipment. These skills will help build teamwork and awareness of the local environment. Offers angling and outdoor skills.	
PE equipment	£2000	New PE equipment required to ensure all sports are adequately covered – e.g. Hockey sticks, table tennis bats, balls, tennis rackets, and badminton nets.	

Playground equipment	£2000	Review of lunchtime equipment. This needs updating every year. Alternative sports equipment for lunch time to support different development of skills rather than just football. Giant chess, scooters, pogo sticks, skipping ropes, wheelie trays and go-karts. (Fixed equipment to be updated through capital). Each class needs their own supply due to Covid.	
School sponsored Sports Kit	£1000	This needs to focus on providing outdoor kit for children to ensure that they do not miss out on sports through the Winter. Team sports kit supplemented through local sponsorship.	
Every class gymnastics trip	£2100	Portsmouth gymnastic centre offers children the opportunity to experience gymnastics in a purpose built arena. Inspiring pupils to try a different sport.	
Subsidised Karate lessons for up to 20 pupils.	£3900	Uptake in Karate has been poor and to encourage children to do it we are going to subsidise 20 places.	
New sports markings on playground/field	£2000	New markings to support introduction of new games.	
Football in the community	£1365	Subsidised sports club with Hawks football club.	>

External dance and sports visitors/coaches to broaden pupil experience.	£5000	Expose children to different sports and dance genres through wither visits or visitors.

This leaves £4758.79 yet to be allocated. Due to Covid a number of sports clubs and trips have had to be postponed along with additional specialist coaches. We will continue to monitor this and allocate the sports spending as soon as possible.
