

RE Long Term Plan

(Revised 2022)

This long term plan is based on using 'Living Difference IV' Hampshire County Council agreed syllabus.

RE units should be **block taught**, ideally in a one day block or if this is not possible in three consecutive afternoon blocks. It is a legal requirement to teach RE as part of the curriculum and an expectation that at Woodcroft Primary School 1 RE unit or topic will be taught each half term.

Key Stage 1 will be taught **Christianity** and **Judaism**, 36 hours across the year.

Years 3 and 4 will be taught **Christianity** and **Hinduism**, 45 hours across the year.

Years 5 and 6 will be taught **Christianity** and **Islam**, 45 hours across the year.

The concepts to be covered in each half are in bold, the context is in standard text.
