This academic year Woodcroft Primary School will receive £17698 for 2022/24. There is no carry forward from previous year.

- build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

Employment of Mr Brown – All day Tuesdays and Monday afternoons to work alongside teachers to deliver various sports activities.	£7883	To up skill the teaching of games across the Year groups. Allow teachers to benefit from working with specialists. Different sports mapped out with PE lead to ensure varied coverage. This includes an after school club that will circulate sports and Year Groups.	
Additional swimming lessons for Years 3, 4 and 5.	£5600	These additional lessons are to help prepare children for achieving end of Year 6 target in swimming. More importantly swimming is an essential skill that all children should have the opportunity to learn. (Year 6 lessons are funded from the curriculum budget)	
New PE Curriculum and CPD	£1920	From Spring 2024 introducing a new PE curriculum, 'Real PE'. This will help deliver structured PE skills and fundamental movements. It will support teachers to deliver the curriculum across Years R to 6.	
Subsidised Karate lessons for up to 20 pupils.	£3750	Uptake in Karate has been poor and to encourage children to do it we are going to subsidise 20 places.	

Football in the community	£1650	Subsidised sports club with Hawks football club.
